## A Year in the Life of the Local Delivery Programme Operational Implementation 2008

A lot has happened on our journey to implement the Local Delivery approach throughout this year. December's newsletter illustrates some of the achievements and milestones reached during 2008.

### Headline Data 2008

- 124 CAFs have been submitted to the Early Intervention & Prevention Panel (some families have more than one CAF where there is more than one child)
- More than 30 initial TACs have taken place covering more than 60 children and young people
- The number of CAFs completed by schools is increasing, with 24 CAFs submitted in December by schools alone (10 of those from secondary schools)
- 10 different agencies/practitioners have completed CAFs to date
- 4 different agencies have adopted the role of Lead professional
- 600 practitioners have attended CAF training

### January

- Operational Implementation begins
- Local Delivery Team Development Manager starts in post
- First CAF training in Wycombe
- Training for Wycombe Governors

### February

- First CAF
- LD administrator appointed
- Performance management framework agreed

### March

- EIP panel meets for first time
- Tracker database designed and in use
- TAC processes and paper work in place
- Services continue their alignment with the 8 Local Delivery Areas (LDAs)
- First Local Delivery Newsletter published, monthly from this point

- 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter performance report
- Process for receiving user feedback from children, young people, parents and carers in place
- TYS progress rating of Partial Practice in place (full to embedded practice in areas which are operational)

## November

- 2 further coordinators appointed
- 100 CAFs completed
- EIP panel pack completed
- SDQ in use to measure change
- Training for governors in the Aylesbury, Marlow, Buckingham and South Bucks LDAs

## December

- 500 practitioners have attended training
- Lessons Learned Review
- First dedicated lead professional workshop
- EIP panel workshop
